April 26 10am All About Owls With Melissa Goodwill

ALL AGES. Melissa is with the Tamarack Wildlife Rehab Center and will introduce you to the feathered hunter of the night! Learn about owl behavior, meet a live owl and maybe a hawk or falcon too. She will have feathers, wings, talons, and recorded owl calls to share.

May 3 10-12pm Bird Hike With Dan Best
